Can photovoltaic panels be cleaned with detergent



Overview

Most cleaning agents, such as glass cleaner and isopropanol, proved suitable for cleaning the studied solar panel glass. The exception was dishwashing detergent and the results suggest that it should not be used when cleaning solar panels. It supports this by highlighting that a simple mixture of water and dish soap, along with soft brushes, is recommended. Julianna Varjopuro sprays the solar panel with a standard glass and mirror cleaner (Mellerud brand was used in the study), which was found to be almost as effective for the studied type of solar panel as a commercial product specifically designed for cleaning solar panels. The Short Answer: For most homeowners, the best solar panel cleaning solution is simply plain water (preferably distilled or deionized) combined with a soft-bristle brush or microfiber cloth. For stubborn dirt like bird droppings, add a few drops of mild dish soap (such as Dawn) to your water. Rinse the residue off the panels with your hose.

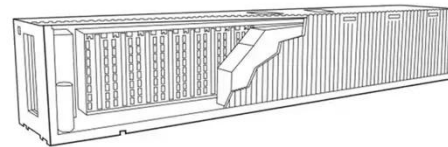

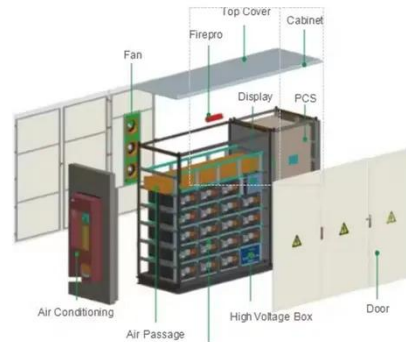

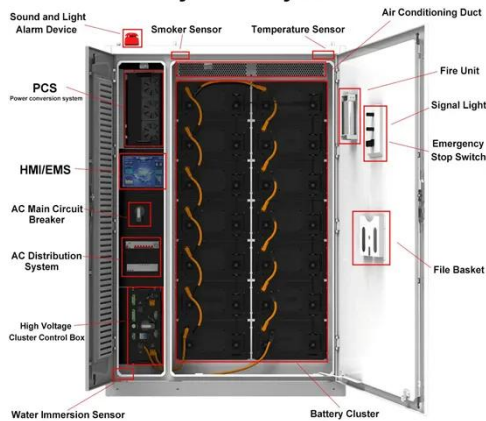
