Well, in northern Myanmar's conflict-affected regions, over 65% of households still lack reliable electricity access according to 2023 data from the Myanmar Renewable Energy Association. Even though hydropower is responsible for most electricity production in Myanmar, the country has rich technical solar power potential that is the highest in the Greater Mekong. In the midst of an ongoing civil war and economic collapse, Myanmar stands at a critical juncture where energy scarcity has ignited an unexpected market boom in solar power, providing a lifeline for millions enduring persistent blackouts. This effort comes amid persistent power shortages and rolling blackouts that have plagued the nation since the military coup in February 2021. 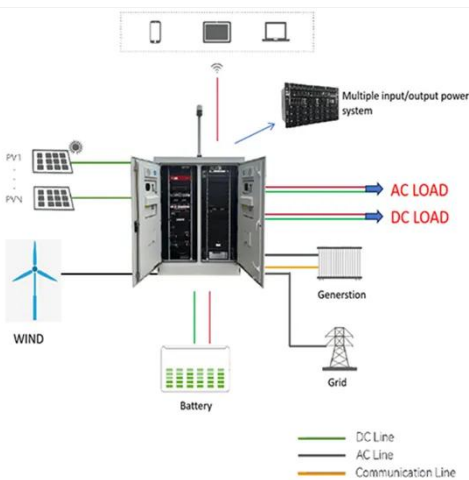

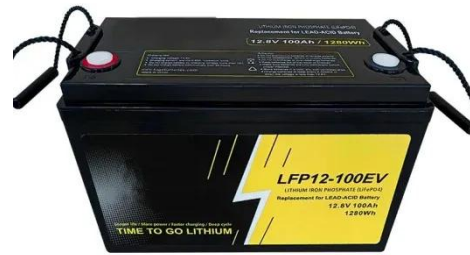
