In a solar PPA, contract terms are typically 20 or 25 years, the installer maintains responsibility for system upkeep (covering some or all). The ITC — also known as the Federal Solar Tax Credit — is a popular tax rebate program offered by the US Federal Government for homeowners looking to switch to clean, renewable solar power. In August of 2022, the United States Congress extended the ITC while at the same time raising the total. 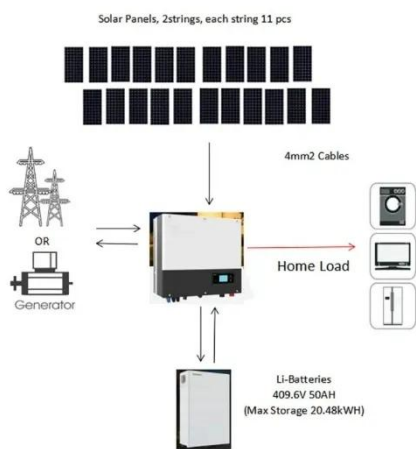
